Before your visit, ask yourself...

- How have I been feeling lately?
- Have I experienced any new side effects?
- Has my blood glucose been mostly in range?
- Have I been taking my medicine(s) consistently, at the right time of day?



Receiving a new diagnosis

- Don't hesitate to ask about terms you don't know. For instance: What is A1C?
- What are the potential complications of diabetes, and how should I look out for them?
- What regular tests should I have?
- Do I need to keep track of my blood glucose? If so, what time of day should I check it?



Starting, switching, or adding a medication

- What are the potential risks and benefits of this medication?
- How will I know if a treatment is working?
- What happens if I miss a dose?
- What should I do if I experience side effects?
- Could this new medicine affect other medicines I am taking?

- What should I be doing to take care of my mental health?




